DIRECTIONS FOR THE CIRCLE DANCE: Children hold hands and walk in a circle singing during chorus, stop and do hand motions during each verse.

NOTE: Many recordings of this song- especially on YouTube, are sung at a fast tempo, making it difficult for young children to both sing and do the motions. I have intentionally recorded it at a slower tempo which also accentuates the lilting and calming quality of the beautiful melody. The capabilities of the young children I sing with always guide my choices of tempo.
